SHAPING HEALTH

We have received a newsletter from the Commission for Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) in Health requesting volunteers to join the Dorset Forum which influences decisions on local health issues. PDC RECYCLING & REFUSE COLLECTION

The new scheme has been running for almost a month now and inevitably there have been a few glitches. Although there are some things we would have thought could have been avoided. The calendar for the A352 route for example is incorrect the officers at PDC are now aware of this and amendments will be issued. If there are any other problems with calendars or households not having the right bins please notify a Parish Councillor and we will provide a consolidated response to PDC to get it put right as soon as possible. It is encouraging though that recycling rates in Purbeck have significantly improved since the introduction of kerbside collections.
